''OOPS'' Announcement

HQ16 thread tension is fairly easy to master PROVIDED bobbin thread tension is set correctly. Thanks to a brain cramp on the part of Frank Fuqua, part of the training on this subject has been done BACKWARDS! The correct way to load the bobbin spool into the bobbin case is as follows.

Place the bobbin spool on a flat surface. The thread should come off the spool over the top and down to the right, making a figure "9". Place the bobbin case, with the open side up, next to the bobbin spool. Maintaining the figure "9" orientation, pick up the spool and place it into the bobbin case. When the thread is drawn up through the case, the spool should turn CLOCKWISE when viewed from the open side of the bobbin case.

Of course, once you become familiar with this process, it is not necessary to place things on a flat surface. Just make sure you end up with the CLOCKWISE spool rotation when viewed from the open side of the bobbin case.

It is obvious that many quilts have been produced with the spool installed backwards. This success has been accompanied by many thread tension problems, which have been caused by incorrect bobbin spool installation.

The HQ16 Operating Manual has been corrected, and Frank is prepared to accept whatever punishment will produce pleasure for those who have been inconvenienced. After "Show and Tell", Frank will provide a demonstration to all HQ certified persons.

<u>General Interest</u>
