2020 Quilt Show - **Home or Favorite State Challenge:** Create a quilt that represents your favorite state or province where you have lived.

The *Shape* of your quilt may be square, round, hexagon or weird shape BUT must be no larger than 18" in any direction and no smaller than 12". There are no limits to the choice of fabrics or embellishments (such as beads, threads, buttons, stamps or paint) that you can use.

The quilt may be pieced, appliqued, raw edge or whatever; but it should reflect that it is a quilt based upon the traditional definition of a quilt: made of two layers of cloth filled with padding held in place by lines of stitching.

Your creation will be shown for the first time at the Voyager Q2 2020 Quilt Show. Please contact Deb Cyros, Quilt Show Chair to sign up for this challenge!

Summer Charity Quilt: Our new Closet Coordinators, Pam Downs and Rosie Posgai, have put together a variety of fabric packets to be used as a starter kit in constructing a Charity Quilt. Please pick out one or more to take home with you this summer. Piece a top and quilt it or bring it back for quilting and completion. The size requested by the charities to which we donate is 48" x 75" or 48" x 60". If you prefer working on smaller projects or don't have much space, please keep in mind that small quilts, placemats, wall hangings, and table runners make great raffle items for Market Daze. Also, we will be participating in the Voyager Holiday Bazaar next December and will need items we can sell.

Our last official Quiltathon of the season will be March 30. We will be finishing up the March Block of the Month as well as a second quilt from February. The room will be open by 9 am and we

generally work until noon or later. You are also welcome to bring a personal project to work on. Snacks to share are always appreciated.

What is the difference between a Class and a Program?

Charity Distribution

The total number of items distributed to charities is 232, however the total count of items *made* for 14 local charities is 157. So where did the other 52 items go? 40 items were raffled during Market Daze, 4 were sold at the Holiday Bazaar, 7 were raffled at the Quilt Show Mini Raffle and 1 was the Silent Auction Quilt! Because all funds earned through the different raffles are earmarked for supplies for charity quilts, all items are counted in the total number of contributions.


It's pretty darned exciting to complete your first longarm quilt! Congratulations to all our new longarmers!
