From the Quality Control Committee... Quality Control Tips

• Borders frame a quilt, or make it larger.

Measure <u>Center</u> of quilt --top to bottom. Use that measurement for the two side borders. Find center of quilt (side) use a placement pin. Find center of side border, pin to center side of quilt, place a pin at each end of side border, work from end to center to adjust any fullness between pins or if necessary to stretch a bit. SEW. PRESS. Do other side the same.

Repeat measurement <u>Across</u> the quilt for top and bottom borders. Sew. Press. You should have a "square" quilt.

Remember: <u>DON'T</u> sew border side, top, bottom as though it were a Log Cabin block. That is apt to produce a very rippled quilt. "We have been there done that this year."
