Block of the Month

Adrienne demonstrated the Block of the Month for our charity quilts. It is a strip quilt using any size strips you have. Using strips $1" - 3\frac{1}{2}"$ wide and at least 14" long works well. Sew strips together until it is large enough to be trimmed down to a $12\frac{1}{2}"$ square after pressing. Adrienne's demo was very striking as she used the same color strip on each end. Next cut the square diagonal and then lay the two diagonal pieces with the right sides facing together and cut diagonally again. You will end up the 4 pieces. Arrange and sew together in a pleasing pattern to form a block. Remember to use $\frac{1}{4}"$ seam allowance.

Adrienne's handout probably has better instructions and is printed on the last page.

REMINDERS

In the cupboard there are small quilt tops that are waiting to be turned into completed quilts - pick one up and take it home or they can be worked on in the quilt room.

The HQ16 long arm quilting machine is available to use for your own quilting at \$5.00 per hour after you have been certified. You must also quilt a charity quilt to be able to use the machine. There are sign-up sheets in the HQ16 room. You can obtain a key from any of the members who are on the list that is posted on the mirror next to the class sign-ups.

Don't forget to bring a quarter (25ϕ) , block of the month if you have completed, your quilting hints written out-to win a prize, and wear your name tag!

(See Strip Magic instructions below)

STRIP MAGIC 12 1/2 "

Start with strips approximately 1" to 3 1/2" wide and at least 14" long.

Sew them together until they measure about 13"

Press to one direction.

Using a square ruler, trim block to 12 $1/2 \times 12 1/2$

Right sides together, turn one block so it's perpendicular to the other and sew a 1/4" seam all around the edges.

Cut an X, corner to corner to give you 4 triangles.

Press open – you will have 4 8 1/2" squares.



Have a 14" ruler or a 14" piece of masking tape near you at the sewing machine to keep track of the strip lengths and how close you are to the edges.

Make sure you stop at 11" before you put your last piece on so you have enough on the ends to make a decent seam.

Feel free to sew strips together to get to 14"

I sew 2 blocks at a time, alternating them until they're both finished.

When you're trimming the block and cutting corner to corner, use the rotating cutting mat.
