Louise Walton presented the December Block of the Month, Monkey Wrench and the pattern goes by many other names. This block is to be 10" square finished (10 ½" unfinished) and should be done in two colors, one light and one dark.

From Pat Rapp: most normally our quilt blocks are 12 ½" and 12 finished when squared. This way all our blocks will match in size and we won't have odd blocks that we can't use in a quilt or will need to make additional blocks of that size.

Susie Johansson and Elaine Vanier will be teaching a binding class on December 15th. Cost is \$5.00 prior to the class and you need to have a quilt, wall hanging, large pot-holder or placemat completed to bind in class. You will need more than one item to bind for the different techniques. Also bring finished binding cut either 2 ½" or 2 ½" wide and longer than will go around your item. Press and fold it in half lengthwise and have your sewing machine ready to sew.

From the Members

Many of you have noticed Claire Fuqua's recent absence from Quilters II activity. Claire is currently engaged in a battle with lung cancer, and has been too busy with doctors, tests, etc. to attend the meetings. She is feeling well, and has continued quilting up a storm in between doctor and hospital visits.

Recently, while reading a novel, Claire encountered the following. It involves a father talking to his kids about the wife/mother who has terminal cancer. It struck a chord, and Claire asked me to include the following excerpt in this report.

"I don't want you guys feeling sorry for her; at least, I don't want you **showing** her that you feel sorry for her. We have to treat her like we've always treated her. We have to keep her laughing. I don't want to see any pity parties going on. The best thing you guys can do for her is to keep on doing what you've always done. That makes her proud. That makes her happy."

Claire starts chemotherapy on December 6th. It will involve three consecutive days of treatment followed by about three weeks of recovery. This will continue for 4 to six cycles, depending on the results. During the rest periods, her activities will be largely governed by how she feels. She is planning to resume meeting attendance as soon as time and treatments permit. She has a very positive attitude, and will appreciate her presence at the meetings being handled as if everything is "normal".
