TIPS:

Some of us quilt barefooted or sock footed. Not a good idea to cut fabric that way, because if you happen to drop an open rotary cutter on your foot, you could get a nasty cut. Lynne Jensen

A "gypsy gripper" is a handy handle that you can attach to your ruler . It makes it a little safer to cut, as your hand isn't down on the ruler, where a slip could cut it. These handles can be

purchased at Loew's, Home Depot, Joanne, and probably Ace and are easily applied to and removed from your ruler. Lynne Jensen

Sulky temporary spray adhesive sprayed on the back of a ruler helps keep it in place while cutting. This is especially helpful with those odd sized, "funny " shaped rulers and templates. It will make the ruler cloudy.....wondering if some alcohol would remove it? You can still see through the ruler. Another suggestion was the fine sandpaper dots with the adhesive backs. Again , they may be purchased at the above stores. Lynne Jensen
