From the HQ16 Coordinator

In order to provide a framework for equitable availability of quilting time on the HQ16, the following policy will be implemented as of December 1, 2007. The policy will be posted by the HQ sign up calendar in the Handi Quilter Room. It has been approved by Lynn Parker, Audrey Young, Claire Fuqua and Carol Monthei.

Reserving HQ16 Time

Scheduled initial/refresher and demonstration classes take priority at all times.

If necessary, class time will displace previously scheduled personal time.

Individual time for charity quilting must be scheduled in advance. In order to provide machine time for the maximum number of quilters, scheduling must be done as follows.

Off Season (April - October)

No restrictions. Generally, no classes are scheduled , and the number of quilters is relatively small.

On Season (November – March)

Each quilter can schedule only one day per week for charity quilting. If a charity quilt is not completed in one day, it must be removed from the machine until the next schedule opportunity.

Obviously, at any time of the year, anyone can quilt anything when nothing is scheduled.
