May you continue to have warm thoughts during this holday season as recipients, from the diverse list of charities, enjoy the 150+ quilts we delivered to them. Following is a list of these charities. If you choose to make a quilt for a specific charity, write the name of that charity on a slip of paper and pin it to your quilt. Note the preferred size request of some charities.

Charities Served:

**Aviva Children's (help abused & neglected children, infant to 18 years); prefer all sizes of quilts.

**Candlelighters (provide support and education for children and adolescents with cancer); prefer baby, lap, and kid size quilts.

**Central Women's Pregnancy Center (serve 20-25 infants monthly); prefer crib size.

**Da Vida Dialysis (serve dialysis patients 45-90 years of age); prefer twin size.

**Devon Gables (serve ages 55-80); prefer lap size quilts.

**El Dorado Generations Unit (serve meals to ages 65 and up); need 10-15 placemats per month.

**Fisher House (a home away from home for veterans or active duty military personnel); prefer lap and twin size quilts.

**Habitat For Humanity (provide housing for low income working people); prefer quilts of all sizes for various ages.

**Hospice (serve terminally ill patents); prefer lap size quilts.

**International Rescue Committee (sponsoring a refugee family from Burundi, Africa); need twin and full size quilts.

**La Paloma Family Services (operate 8 group homes and 100 foster care homes in Pima County; support more than 350 children in foster care); prefer baby, toddler, twin, full and queen size quilts.

**Med Wagon (transport sick children in IV equipped wagon in the hospital); need medwagon size quilts.

**Mobile Meals (serve meals to ages 21 and over); need 20 placemats 4 times a year.

**Pio Decimo (serve needy families & children); prefer all sizes of quilts.

**Posada Del Sol (assisted living for ages 30 to 100); prefer twin size quilts.

**Quilt For A Cause (quilt auction to benefit breast cancer, held again 2009); prefer all sizes of quilts.

**Salvation Army (serve meals to needy people); need placemats.

**Those Who Care (serve 1 month to 18 yrs. but mostly teens); prefer twin, crib and lap quilts.

**Tucson Women's & Children's Center (serve victims of domestic violence); prefer all sizes of quilts.

**UMC Children's Cancer Center (treat children birth to 18 yrs. old with cancer); prefer all sizes of quilts.

**Veteran's Hospital (serve veterans of U.S. military); prefer all sizes of quilts of non-feminine colors.

**Villa Maria (assisted living for elderly); prefer all sizes of quilts.

I have many pieces/scraps of fleece and flannel, but we also need "fabric" to cover the raw edges of the blocks. This fabric could be ribbon, bias tape, trims,or long pieces of regular materials.

I know many of you are "home for the holidays". If you are have trims, ribbons, etc. that you would like to put to good use, bring them back with you so we can incorporate them into a warm quilt.

There will be a class to teach techniques and create some of these quilts on Wednesday, January 9, 2008 from 9 - 12.
