Judges Comments on "Just for Today I Will Not Worry" Design elements are balanced and create circular motions. Pleasing use of peacock motifs with gold thread painting and crystals adding dimension. Black is visually overwhelming and there is concern about stability of the loose components. Circular component not entirely symmetrical. Strive for smooth curves and even stitch length in quilting. Good binding technique.
