Norma Kindseth is making great progress on the circles and will give color advice to any to get them off our wall.

At intro time, we learned to go from Z to A, and we finished the meeting with color crayon work on 6" muslin squares, so we are getting younger everyday.

At show'n tell time, Fran and Joan Lichtenberg demonstrated the "lumpless binding join" method to finish a quilt. (with help from Jan Tuttle) We used the completed 6 circle block quilt by Jeanette Hooper that was quilted by Fran Walthall, Carol Monthei and Ellie Briefer to learn feathers. So, you see, getting a quilt done is a group effort always.
