It you haven't seen it, it may be displayed at the Saturday Coffee on Jan 3rd (Adrienne Bortell is doing the hand stitching of the binding so we will start selling tickets on Jan 3rd if she is able to get it completed, otherwise we will start on Jan. 10th). Anne Herman is working with a committee to do a write-up about the quilt which we will put in the Quilt Shops and send to the area Quilt Guilds.

We have several January calendar items --- a very busy month:

Jan. 5th – New Block of the Month --- traditional one – Fran says you will like it. No circles! However, several circle blocks were brought in today and Louise was the lucky winner --- she will make something outstanding with them!

Julie Young reported that Beverly Polito delivered several quilts to Fisher House while she was home for Holidays.

There will be further discussion on donating quilts this year for Habitat since Voyager will not be building a house as they have done in the past. Several members expressed an interest in continuing supporting Habitat as long as we know there is an actual family that will receive the quilts and they do not go into the Habitat Store.

Adrienne will give a treasurer's report next week. She also reviewed with us the use of freezer paper when copying text or photos on fabric.

We had a short discussion on the virtues of washing and drying your fabrics before using in your quilts and the advantages of using the "color grabber" when washing. In fact, JoAnne Brown commented that her guild at home requires that all the quilts given to the Children's Hospital be washed in advance to remove any chemicals or dyes!

Audrey Young showed us the quilts she made from her "adopt-a-box" which had several fabrics of various sizes pertaining to games and gambling. She also suggested that when piecing strips or squares together that you cut your fabric the same width as binding so that you don't waste any fabric --- what you don't use as sashing can be used for the binding. As usual, her quilts were very innovative and inspiring. We need more members to "adopt-a-box".

Vel Peters' husband is recovering nicely from his heart surgery – already walking around Voyager, and we understand that Maureen Roberts is home following her back surgery and coming along very well. Keep them in your thoughts and prayers.

Anne Herman went to the Activity Office and invited Debby Mitchell, Voyager Activity Director; and Joe Boyd, Voyager Park General Manager to come over to the Quilt Room to see our beautiful Spring Raffle Quilt.
